
Matthew Dallen, 11KAS

Student Leadership

Encouraging pupil engagement in leadership roles and empowering students to have a voice in school improvements were a couple of our primary objectives at the start of this academic year. As we finish the summer term, we can reflect on how over 400 members of our student cohort have been emboldened to actively participate in leadership positions.

Ensuring the pupils had a



chance to meet frequently and engage in rigorous discussion was important to us. In September, students democratically elected members to the Whole School Council, Year Team Councils, Active Sports Council and SMART Trust Council. Proposing, discussing and implementing agendas were common-place throughout the year, with the Senior Leadership Team listening to suggestions for change. Successes included: the renaming of The Hub to Liskeard School Wellbeing Hub, change to our lunchtime routines, and the enrolment of fundraising initiatives.

Upper School Prefects were elected for Year 11 and Year 10, with our lead students engaging with lower year groups on student led schemes, as well as representing the school at key moments across the school calendar. Similarly, lower school students were able to participate in our cultural capital award, The Master Mission, working on exciting tasks in order to complete their Bronze, Silver and Gold awards. Our Year 8 Peer Mentors have additionally demonstrated expert counselling, kindness and guidance in their tutoring of our new cohort of Year 6 pupils in their transition to secondary school.

LSCC's inaugural Charity Day marked a successful end to the school year. Student leaders from across the Sixth Form, KS4 and KS3 spectrum organised a series of sponsored



walks, raising a huge sum of money for our designated school charities. An example of the community spirited nature our of young people.

We look forward to continuing our established leadership programmes next year and are excited about new opportunities to boost student sovereignty over their lives here at school.
